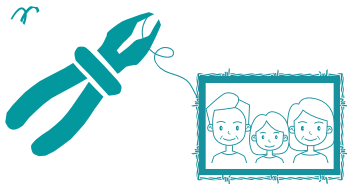
## Building history, one model at a time

## WHEN DO CLUBS MEET?

Clubs meet every day during the big break. You will find a club schedule on the bulletin board of your classroom by early October. Make sure you **pay attention to the morning announcements** because club meetings may change.

## HOW DO I KNOW WHEN A CLUB STARTS AND WHERE IT MEETS?

Most clubs will start after October 2nd. When a club starts, there will be a morning announcement to inform you of the day, time, and meeting place.



## HOW DO I BECOME A MEMBER OF A CLUB?

You become a member of a club by attending a meeting. There is no registration. Don't worry if you miss one meeting, as you can still go to the next one.



## WANT TO VISIT 2 CLUBS BUT THEY MEET ON THE SAME DAY. WHAT CAN I DO?

If they meet exactly at the same time, you have to decide which club you want to participate in. You cannot participate in both.



## CAN I JOIN A CLUB AFTER IT HAS ALREADY STARTED?

Yes, but not long after it has started--you should try to go to the 2nd meeting if you missed the first one. However, be prepared for the possibility of not being accepted by the advisor. For clubs that involve competitions, if the teams have already been formed, you may not be admitted. In any case, it doesn't hurt to ask the club advisor.



## WHAT DO I DO IF A CLUB IS FULL?

If a club is full, you can try going to its 2nd meeting the following week. It is very common for clubs to be very busy in the first meeting and then become less crowded. Also, if a club is in high demand, the advisor may decide to open it up to more students on a bi-weekly basis. It is definitely worth revisiting a club that you are interested in.



## CAN I JOIN A CLUB IF IT IS NOT FOR 1ST FORMERS?

Not really! Advisors have reasons for deciding that their club addresses certain forms and not others.

## DO I HAVE TO GO TO CLUBS IN ALL CATEGORIES?



Not necessarily. We do advise you, however, to be as open-minded as possible and to try different things, instead of only focusing on one category; you never know what hidden talent you may discover!

## HOW MANY CLUBS CAN I GO TO?

If there is a club that interests you every day of the week, you could go to 5 different clubs! That may be too much, however. Try 2-3 clubs per week!
