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
Environment that best promotes children's English language development

- Low stress
- Focus on message, not grammatical form
- Awash with comprehensible input
- Interactive tasks
- Immersion in age-appropriate subject matter
- Recycling of language elements
- Caring adult engaging individual child
- Children speaking when they're ready
- Opportunities for real communication
- Maximized use of English
- Errors are tolerated; experimentation is encouraged



Communicative English-language teaching: principles

- Maximize use of English
- Focus on content
- Promote task-based activities
- Tolerate errors




- Encourage language experimentation
